The Editors Turn

In the familiar and typical car show format, the <u>static display</u>, a vehicle is positioned in a fixed location and the viewer moves around to appreciate it's features and appearance.

In an alternative car show format, the <u>kenetic display</u>, the vehicle is in motion and the viewer is in a stationary location while appreciating it's features and appearance. This type of display is often called a parade lap, pace lap, or a race and usually includes the addition of sound, vibration and smell to stimulate the senses.

Last month we had the pleasure of experiencing one of the best examples of a kenetic display, The Rolex 24 Hours of Daytona race in Florida. This multi-day event included static displays of vintage race cars and new car vendors as well as kenetic displays (races) of vintage race cars and present day, high tech racers. The events varied in length from 30 minute "support races" up to a 24 hour long feature race that included four different classes of modern race cars that ran day and night, rain or shine. It was a great event that I would recommend to every serious car guy or gal.

Consider adding a kenetic event (race) to your bucket list. Perhaps the 12 Hours of Sebring or the 10 Hour Petit Lemans race at Road Atlanta. Each one is a unique experience that you will surely enjoy.

Below are some of the sights at the Rolex 24 Hour race for you to enjoy. As you look at the pictures, listen carefully to here the sound and feel the vibration as the engines roar to life. There is nothing like the smell of racing gas in the morning. Life is good!
