










The Business Meeting

Swamp Fox Rides

"The Educated Shoebox"

What you see in the pictures that follow, is the history of my classic 1951 Ford. This story is not one of just its technical being. It is also the story of how it was a conduit to life's experiences for three generations

For the past four and a half years, it has been my labor as well as my privilege, to restore this car. It is my hope that it looks as comparable as it did the day it came off the assembly line in Norfolk, Virginia in January 1951.

As our family legend goes, my grandfather, Mr. Toland Stewart, bought the car brand new. We have been told he paid cash when he purchased it from Hunter Motor Company here in Florence. He had a farm at the corner of Ebenezer and Hoffmeyer Crossroads. This was his primary vehicle until his death in 1966. After his death, my father Gus Stewart took ownership of the car.

My recollection of learning to drive happened with this car. My granddaddy's farm was right down the road from where I-95 was being constructed. Before the highway was paved, my father would take me out on the graveled highway there and teach me the mechanics of driving.

During the late '60s and early '70s, the car began its education. My sister drove it to high school in her junior and senior years. Upon her graduation, she drove the car to the University of Georgia. When it had completed its course of study there, my brother drove it to the University of South Carolina for his undergrad studies.

My opportunity to enrich its education came when I attended Newberry College. After two years, my brother once again took the limited ownership while he attended law school at the University of South Carolina. Its final course in its advancement for higher education came when I drove it to the then Francis Marion College.

Its education is not the only element to the story. It has been a vital part of the story of my immediate family. The picture of the couple standing beside it was taken in December of 1980. It is that of my wife, Debbie and me before we were married. It is also the car we borrowed from my father and drove it away from the church on our wedding day.

As time went on, my father put the car in his garage at his home here in Florence. He drove it sporadically, but it seemed to have served its purpose.

In 1988, my family and I were visiting from Pennsylvania. Since we now had a house with a garage of our own, my father told me to take the car. So, I drove it from South Carolina to Pennsylvania.

In 1990, after relocating to Tennessee, I had the car shipped from Pennsylvania. We lived there for fourteen years where it was garaged and driven occasionally. Then in 2002, I made the decision to put the car in storage until my retirement, buy a motorcycle. I had the car stored in a friend's warehouse for thirteen years. In June of 2015, it came back to Florence.

Upon its return to where its story began, I have worked to bring it back into focus. Everything is original to the car with the exception to the side view mirrors and the seatbelts. The chrome has been re-chromed, the engine and transmission has been rebuilt, wiring and all other items restored to its originality. The back windshield still has the FMC Alumni '79-'80 sticker where has been since I put it there.


I need to mention the support that I received with this project; the paint and body work was by Jonathan Rivers at Phaze3Kustoms. The interior work was done by Don Wolfe at Don's Trim Shop. Technical support and majority of parts were supplied from Chris Whittington of Shoebox Central, Oklahoma City. Early Ford V8 Sales, Piedmont SC, did the rebuild of the engine and VanPelt Sales, Batavia OH, did the transmission. Chrome plating was done with R&D Finishing and Tri-City Plating, both out of Elizabethton, TN. Last but most important, the many hours of blood, sweat and tears from my garage.

And finally the vanity plate on the tail end cannot be ignored. That was the suggestion of my wife Debbie. I must mention that she tightened a few bolts or two, moved the seats in and out more times than she can count, and moved the hood and trunk lids along with many parts up to the attic and back to the garage numerous times.

I am very proud of the outcome. As I have said it was a labor of love. I would like to think my grandfather and father would be proud also.
