This Special Edition of the Swamp Fox Old Car Club Newsletter is created to feature our tour of the National Auto and Truck Museum which we visited while at the 2019 AACA Annual Grand National Meet in Auburn, IN.

The NATM is located in two former factory buildings of the Auburn Automobile Company. The Service Building was built in 1923 and was used for test driving of automobiles, factory service and distribution of parts to distributors and dealers all over the world. The L29/Experimental Building was built in 1928-29 and was the first new building that E.L. Cord constructed after he assumed the management of the company.

The NATM features examples of post war cars and trucks that range from of 1907 to the 1960s. It also features a toy car and truck museum within the main museum that exhibits examples that range from 1894 to present.
