Swamp Fox Rides

When Old Was New: The story of the preservation of a 2000 Corvette.

The fifth generation of the Corvette was introduced in 1997 and was produced thru 2004. The first model was introduced as a coupe in 1997 and followed by the addition of the convertible in 1998 and the hardtop in 1999. All three body styles shared the new exterior, interior, LS1 engine and transaxle as part of the completely redesigned fifth generation car.

Soon after the new car was introduced I began further research and developed a case of "Corvette Fever". This was not the first time that I had come down with the fever. By 1999 it was time to treat my fever by ordering a new 2000 Corvette convertible.

The ordering process was simple, load it up and add it up. The only question was what should the color be, Red or Blue. Well the book by the same name says "All Corvettes are Red". So too was this one, Torch Red. We ordered the car from Steve Moore Chevrolet in Florida on 6/4/99. It was built on 11/8/99 and delivered to the Florence Chevy dealer on 11/15/99.

The first trip with the new Corvette was to attend the Rolex 24 hour race at the Daytona International Speedway, February 5-6, 2000. Before the race we took the opportunity to take a parade lap of the Daytona Speedway road course with the Corvette Club. On the return trip to Florence it rained all the way back.

We repeated the same trip and parade lap experience the following year, February 3-4, 2001. The highlight of this race was to see Dale Earnhardt Sr. and Jr. along with the other factory drivers Kelly Collins and Andy Pilgrim race the #3 C5R Corvette during the 24 hour race. They looked like they were having fun.

Another trip that we have made many times in the fall is to attend the Petit Lemans sports car races at Road Atlanta in Braselton, GA. It is a scenic facility with a 2 ½ mile road course. We have enjoyed taking parade laps with the Corvette, top down, and then watching the races from many locations around the track. Think of it as a 10 hour car show in motion. Its lots of fun for everyone!

But the story of the Corvette would not be complete without emphasizing the continued effort to preserve and maintain the car in its original configuration and condition. We have enjoyed the car for the last 20 years and hope for many more. It is garage kept and used sparingly. Yes, the paint is original, as is the top, interior, drivetrain, etc. The mileage is now showing 19,154 miles.



Automotive History

The Alpha Romeo 8C 2900 was considered by many to be the most technically advanced sports car built before World War II. The 8C 2900 was unquestionably a near-perfect combination of grace, beauty, power and agility. The origins of the 8C 2900 can be traced to 1931 when an outstanding eight-cylinder engine was developed by Alfa Romeo's chief engineer, Vittorio Jano. This new straight-eight had a 2.3-liter displacement and featured twin overhead camshafts, plus a supercharger. The cylinder block, nondetachable head, crankcase and valve covers were cast in weight-saving aluminum alloy. Mounted in a single-seat Grand Prix chassis, the 8C 2300 engine was nearly unbeatable on the race track.

Over the next few years, the engine received several modifications, including enlargement of the cylinders, which raised the displacement to 2.9 liters. In 1935 the Alfa Romeo racing team, directed by Enzo Ferrari, created a two-seat sports car designated the 8C 2900A. Six of these two-seaters were built for the company's racing team and were very successful. Often called "Two-Nines" because of their 2.9 liter displacement, they became the prototypes for the more popular and comfortable Two-Nine B models, introduced in 1937. The high price of these limited-edition cars and the fact that Alfa Romeo was involved in building aircraft engines for the Italian government limited production to 30 Two-Nine B models.

Because of rule changes in several major races forbidding superchargers, the Two-None B saw less competition than the A Model. However, in 1938 four specially prepared Two-Nine B Alfa Romeo roadsters were entered in the Mille Miglia. These cars, with lightweight bodies of exceptional styling, captured first, second, and third places. At Le Mans, in a streamlined Two-Nine coupe, the Alpha Romeo team led for 18 of the 24 hours, but a broken valve forced them out of the race despite a 100-mile lead. A month later in the 24-hour endurance race at Spa, Two-Nines won first and second place. Many other events in Europe, England and South America were also won by Two-Nines raced by both the factory and by private owners.

War ended production of the 8C 2900 series in 1939. But after the armistice, racing drivers who were able to obtain the prewar wonders began reestablishing the legend of Two-Nines. In 1947 the Mille Miglia was won by an unsupercharged long-wheelbase Two-Nine coupe. The next year in the first Watkins Glen Grand Prix, Alfa Romeo dealer Frank Griswold thrilled American spectators by winning the event in his ten-year-old Two-Nine supercharged coupe. Then in 1951 the great racing driver Phil Hill won the Del Monte Handicap in California .and placed fourth in the Pebble Beach Cup race in a 1938 Two-Nine roaster. On three continents over a period of some 15 years, the Two-Nine Alfa Romeo set new standards and built a legacy for all performance cars that were to follow.
