WELCOME TO FLORIDA

The Cape Canaveral Region would like to extend a warm welcome to all AACA members who are attending. The area is blessed with beautiful weather in February boasting of a sunny average daytime temperature of 78 degrees and very little rain. We are being hosted by the American Muscle Car Museum in Melbourne which is only a 1 hour drive from the Orlando resorts of Disney World, Seaworld etc. Our host hotel is immediately adjacent to the Melbourne Airport and a little more than 1 hour from both the Orlando International and Orlando Sanford airports both of which feature low airfares from most of the country. Secondary hotels are a little less than 10 minutes from the showfield.

Our host for the event, the American Muscle Car Museum is a private collection owned by Mr. Mark Pieloch. This collection of over 325 cars features Indy Pace Cars, Porsches, Shelbys, and Yenkos and a group of bicycles, gas pumps, signs and much more. Visit their website at americanmusclecarmuseum.com. This museum is NOT open to the general public, however, each car registered and each judge will receive a ticket to the museum!! Extra tickets for Saturday admission can be purchased for \$20.00. Since this is a private property, we have a few special rules for this event. Please note them on the following pages before you register.

Due to the presence of the Disney Resorts, we enjoy some unbelievably low airfares from many areas of the country (in many cases well planned trips can be under 100 dollars round trip to Sanford or Orlando) which will allow you to fly in, rent a car and still enjoy lower costs than many areas of the country, The Melbourne Airport is immediately adjacent to the host hotel. Our Host Hotel is the **Hilton Rialto** in Melbourne. It is directly next to the Melbourne Airport and will have a limited shuttle to the showgrounds, based on availability. It is 5.6 miles from the showfield. Secondary Hotels are the Holiday Inn and the Hyatt both about 9 miles from the show field.

Motor home parking will be in a lot adjacent to the property and is a 300 yard walk to the museum and showfield. Trailer parking is on the property. DAY OF SHOW PARKING IS ON THE ADJACENT LOT AND MUST BE RESERVED. Come join us and enjoy our beautiful February weather.

The Hornets Nest Region extends a cordial Welcome to all fellow AACA members attending the Southeastern Division Nationals. April is a great time of year to visit Charlotte and we are especially pleased that you have chosen to participate in the Spring Nationals. The AACA Nationals is being held during the Hornets Nest Region's Charlotte AutoFair (produced each Spring & Fail) at Charlotte Motor Speedway. Credentials for Charlotte AutoFair will be provided to each AACA Owner regis-tering a vehicle and to each registered AACA Judge. The Speedway is located on NC Highway 29 North in Con-cord, NC. The Nationals site is most easily accessed from Intersate 85, using the US 29 exit—the Speedway is about three miles North.

three miles worm. Another recommended route is the use of the NC 49 Exit from Interstate 485, two miles South into the town of Harris-burg — turn left onto Morehead Road to the Speedway.

Charlotte Area Attractions Charlotte Motor Speedway is the hub of NASCAR racing facilities to be found in the larger Charlotte metropolitan area. Near the Speedway, Concord Mills Shopping Center is situated at Interstate 85 Exit 49—about two miles from the Speedway and US29 on Bruton Smith Blvd. This is one of the world fa-mous Mills destination malls and includes a Bass Pro-Shop, many specialty stores, and a multitude of restaurants.

many specially stores, and a multilude of restaurants. The LYNX Blue line (light rail train line) runs a 20 mile route from the University of North Carolina at Charlotte (UNCC) on North Tryon Street (about four miles from the Speedway) with stations through uptown Charlotte, and South to the Pineville area. There are 26 stations and the train runs every 20 minutes until BPM, then every 30 minutes until 2AM. Uptown Uptown Charlotte also has a Gold Line streetar route that runs all day, seven days each week. The NASCAR Hall of Fame is on Brevard Street in uptown Charlotte near the Convention Center and the NBA Charlotte Hornets Arena is on East Trade Street. The Bank of America Stadium, home of the NFL Carolina Panthers, has a collecta-bles shop in the Stadium at Mini Street and Stonewall Street. Uptown Charlotte features Discovery Place, a hands-on science museum for adults and children. Also there is the cultural campus on South Tryon Street which includes the Mini Museum Craft-Design; the Bechtler Museum of Modern Art; and the Gantt Center for African-American Arts. **Full Service Camping Choices**

Driven Show Vehicles For Thursday and Friday, driven show vehicle owners may request special parking credentials. No trailers or campers will be allowed with this request.

<u>Thursday</u> Charlotte AutoFair opens at 8 AM to the public (7 AM to Ven-dors) Thursday thru Sunday. The AACA Registration envelope can be picked up at the AACA Tent adjacent to the AACA Nationals Field at Charlotte AutoFair - the AACA Tent opens at 10 AM. AACA hospitality will be open at the same location.

<u>Friday</u> The vehicle registration pick-up and hospitality continues at the AACA Tent adjacent to the AACA Nationals Field - opening at 10 AM. Race Car and Two-Wheeler condition runs will begin in the morning on the private paved road adjacent to the Trailer Parking area. Following in the aftermoon is the AACA Judging School, which will take place at the Media Center in the Speed-way Infield. See Event Schedule for time on all events.

Saturday Vehicle registration pick-up moves Saturday to the AACA Na-tionals Field entrance on the Speedway grounds where vehi-cles may begin entering at 7 AM. The Judges Breakfast will be held in the AACA tent adjacent to the Nationals Field All vehi-cles must be on the Field for judging to begin at 11 AM and remain until released by the Chief Judge at 3 PM.
